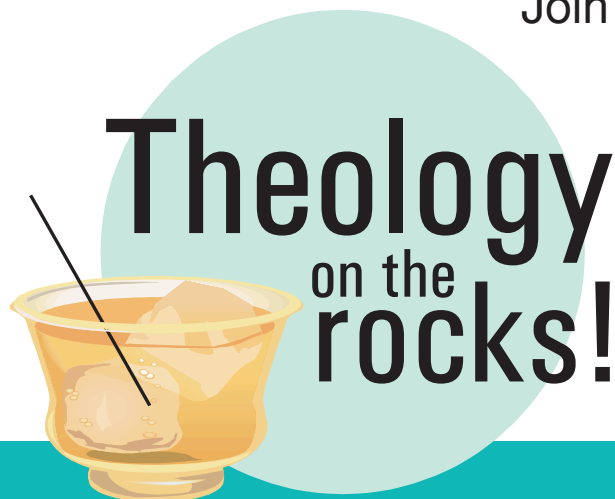

Deacon Keith has extensive experience in creating and sustaining processes and programs of evangelization and formation at the group, parish, and diocesan level that focuses on the making, maturation, and mission of disciples of Jesus Christ. He is also the Executive Director of Ablaze Ministries and a long-time teacher and collaborator with the Catherine Siena Institute. He is co-author, along with six other collaborators, with Sherry Weddell for *Becoming a Parish of Intentional Disciples*—a follow up to the best selling book, *Forming Intentional Disciples*.
